

K.T. & Jerry Archer Public Service Veterinary Scholarship

Established to support students on the basis of need and merit who wish to pursue a public service project related to veterinary medicine.

Mary Kemble Barnes Memorial Award

This award is established to assist rising second or third year students who work as volunteers in a humane society clinic. It is awarded on a combination of academic merit and financial need.

Carolyn Beeman Memorial Veterinary Award

This is a fund to support a DVM student within the Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine.

Bil-Jac Nutrition Award

This award is given to recognize a second or third year student tracking small animal studies, showing an interest in small animal nutrition, and ranked in the upper one third of the class.

Dr. G. Daniel Boon Memorial – Excellence in Veterinary Clinical Pathology

An award each year to the student with the highest grade in the Clinical Pathology course.

Dr. Olive K. Britt Equine Award

An award established to recognize the benefits which a life of dedication to the many people and animals of the equine industry can yield to the Commonwealth and surrounding states, and to assist students in embracing the very best opportunities for learning.

Dr. A. Cleveland Brown Award

An award for a student who has completed the third year, must rank in the top 20% of their class, and be a Maryland resident.

Dr. Bob Brown Awards

These awards are donated by Dr. Bob Brown. Each consists of a plaque.

Awards are made in four categories:

Leadership - This award recognizes proficiency in leadership, emphasizing group interest above self interest, commitment to community, integrity, courage, good morals and ethics, decision making skills, consensus-building skills, strong work ethic, common sense and dedication.

Entrepreneurship - This award recognizes good business and people skills, personal financial management, visionary, ethics, willingness to take risks, self motivation, creativity, and work ethic.

Communication - This award recognizes excellence in communication skills, keen sense of perception, listening skills, networking and presentation skills, expressiveness, accurate interpretation, confidence, ability to relate to others, humor, and compassion.

Team Player - This award recognizes good ability to work together with others, good collaboration skills, cooperative spirit, ability to share, ability to keep the confidences of others, and working for the betterment of the group.

Dr. J. D. Carter Award

This award is established in memory of Dr. J. D. Carter and is given to a financially deserving student who has performed well academically and who is interested in pursuing a career in private practice.

Herman and Mildred Corder Award

An award established to provide funds to Virginia residents achieving academically, involved in community service, who have good character, and financial need.

Kay Daugherty Spirit Award

This award was established by family, classmates, and friends as a lasting tribute and memorial to Katie ("Kay") Lynette Daugherty (Class of 1992). It is given to recognize and promote those qualities of sincerity, compassion, and humor which Kay exemplified, emphasizing the importance and relevance of these qualities and the role they should play within the veterinary profession.

This recipient is chosen by vote of the first year class.

The John W. Davis Memorial Award

This award is given to a student who demonstrates ambition and a desire to pursue studies in wildlife diseases.

The Bob Duncan Memorial Diagnostic Veterinary Pathology Award

This award is presented to a fourth year DVM student with a demonstrated ability, commitment, and zeal for diagnostic veterinary pathology.

“Trouble” English Veterinary Student Scholarship

This award is given to a third year student who has demonstrated interest and proficiency in small animal internal medicine and gastroenterology.

VMRCVM Equine Reproduction Award

An annual award funded by the Equine Stallion Auction and presented to a student who has completed the third year and based on a demonstrated interest in equine reproduction.

Simon Eyre Award

This award is given to honor a veterinary student who has demonstrated a commitment to wildlife biology or environmental sciences. The recipient must be in good academic standing and be financially deserving.

Herman Fiedler Award for Students From Rural Areas

This award is provided by Dr. Marion F. Ehrich in memory of her father to recognize a student who has been reared in a rural area, graduated in a small public high school class, and has financial need.

Ruth S. Fleming Award

An award given to rising third year veterinary students who have demonstrated good academic progress and financial need.

Jane Nusz Foy Memorial Scholarship

An award for a Maryland resident in the third year of the DVM curriculum on the basis of financial need.

Giving Back Scholarship

An award established to provide support for a DVM student based on financial need.

Greater Fredericksburg Kennel Club Award

This award is given to rising second year Virginia residents with a bachelor's degree and undergraduate academic achievement.

Dr. Robert C. Hammond Award

An award for two Maryland resident students who have completed third year, and who have demonstrated the most improvement in academic studies. These students have also shown integrity and dedication to the profession.

Harford County Veterinary Medical Association Scholarship

An award for a Maryland resident rising fourth year student. Preference is given to applicants who are residents of Harford County, Maryland.

Richard S. Hawe Quest for Excellence Award in Small Animal Medicine

An award based on demonstrated commitment to academic excellence and commitment to entering small animal general practice as opposed to an intention to pursue an internship/residency in preparation for entering a specialty practice or academia.

Gary Lee Lake Memorial Scholarship

Established to support Maryland resident DVM students who have demonstrated a sincere and dedicated interest in veterinary medicine.

Clarence and Gertrude Leach Memorial Award

A four-year award donated by Miss Mary Leach in memory of her parents, Clarence and Gertrude Leach, to be applied toward tuition costs. This scholarship is given to a financially deserving student on the basis of academic achievement and a demonstrated interest in agricultural practice.

Maryland Higher Education Commission Scholarship

Awarded to provide financial assistance to Maryland resident DVM students in the VA-MD Regional College of Veterinary Medicine

Cecil and Shirlee Maxson Award

An award given to a veterinary student based on academic achievement in honor and perpetual memory of their very special cat and friend "Dr. Boo", who enriched the lives of all who knew him, as well as their other wonderful pets and the talented veterinarians who cared for them all.

Kirby McCaffrey Memorial Award

This award was established by members of the VMRCVM Class of 1985 in memory of their classmate, Dr. Kirby McCaffrey. It is to be given to a rising third year student from Maryland with demonstrated financial need.

Dr. O. W. "Mac" McClung Memorial Award

Awarded to students attending Virginia Tech at the College of Veterinary Medicine, based on need and the exhibition of both compassion and common sense in all dealings with animals, owners, colleagues, and staff. Secondary priority shall be for membership in the Corps of Cadets at Virginia Tech as an undergraduate.

The Nancy Morrisette Memorial Veterinary Award

An award established with preference given to financial need and relevant family circumstances.

Eula Ratliff Munsey Memorial Scholarship

This award is to support students in their 3rd or 4th year of the DVM curriculum who are interested in small animal medicine or surgery, have a gpa of 3.0 or better, and have demonstrated financial need. Preference shall be first to students from Buchanan County, VA, the south west part of Virginia, then to students from elsewhere in Virginia upon admission.

MVMA Auxiliary Award

An award for a student who has completed the second year and is a Maryland resident with financial need.

MVMA Past Presidents Award

An award for a student who is a Maryland resident, has completed his or her third year, and must have demonstrated a leadership role in student government and/or organized student veterinary medicine while attending veterinary college.

National Capital Kennel Club Award

The National Capital Kennel Club has established an award for students who "want to honor the value that animals, especially dogs, play in our lives". Applicants must demonstrate financial need and preference is given to residents of the District of Columbia or surrounding counties in Maryland or Virginia.

The Nestle Purina Award for Excellence in Companion Animal Nutrition

This award is presented to a rising fourth year student who demonstrates exemplary academic achievement, collegiality, a strong interest in nutrition and physiology, and financial need.

Florence A. Nocka Endowed Award

An annual award given to DVM students who have demonstrated an aptitude for veterinary medicine, particularly in the area of feline medicine, and have financial need.

North American Veterinary Conference Award

An award presented to a student in good academic standing to attend the North American Veterinary Conference in Orlando, Florida.

Novartis Animal Health Parasitology Award

An award provided by Novartis Animal Health to recognize the student with the highest grade in Veterinary Parasitology.

Pfizer Animal Health Veterinary Award

An award presented to a third year student who, through their ability, dedication, and character, has attained a high level of academic achievement and productivity, and who has a high level of financial need.

Michael Pirrung Award

This award is given to a Virginia resident who is a rising fourth year student with an identified career goal of mixed animal practice. The recipient must be able to demonstrate satisfactory academic progress and show that he/she is personally contributing at least 25% of their educational expenses.

Pudgie Memorial Humane Award

This award is established in memory of Pudgie the Cat to recognize and promote humane and compassionate treatment of animals. The award is given to second, third, or fourth year students, or intern or resident, who has demonstrated outstanding efforts to alleviate animal suffering, prevent or stop animal abuse, rescue animals from neglectful or dangerous circumstances, and/or provide education and outreach on humane animal treatment.

Harry M. and Mildred M. Raulet Memorial Award

An award to honor students with academic achievement, clinical proficiency, and financial need.

Ridgway Family Persistency & Consistency Veterinary Scholarship

Established to recognize and honor students who demonstrate hard work and tenacity as they go through their DVM curriculum

The Roanoke Valley Horseman's Association Award

An annual award presented to a student who is a resident of the Roanoke Valley or surrounding area and has met satisfactory academic requirements and demonstrated interest and aptitude for equine medicine.

Dr. Jocelyn L. Rodgers Award for Equine Studies

An award given in memory of Dr. Jocelyn Leighty Rodgers (Class of 1999), and is awarded to a 4th year student interested in Equine Practice.

Salsbury Award

A commemorative certificate and cash award given by Dr. and Mrs. John G. Salsbury in memory of his father, Dr. J. E. Salsbury, to students with financial need who have demonstrated superior scholarship, initiative, perseverance, and leadership potential.

Salsbury Poultry Fellowship

A multiyear fellowship given by Dr. and Mrs. John G. Salsbury in memory of his father, Dr. J. E. Salsbury, to a student with a demonstrated commitment to poultry medicine and research. Recipient is nominated by the poultry faculty based on aptitude, academic achievement, and leadership potential.

SCAVMA Award

An award for students in recognition of contributions made by providing service to the college, community, or veterinary profession. These scholarships are provided by the VMRCVM Student Chapter of the American Veterinary Medical Association.

Schering-Plough Animal Health Award

Schering-Plough Animal Health has established this award to honor a rising fourth year student who has a demonstrated interest in medicine and/or surgery, strong academic merit, and financial need.

Dr. Harry L. Schultz Memorial Award

An award for a student who is a Maryland resident, completed his/her second year of veterinary school, and who is a legal resident of Baltimore City or Baltimore County.

Dr. Claire Seifert Memorial Overcoming Award

Established to assist a student who has overcome special challenges during his or her time as a vet student. Preference given to 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year students.

The Pamela M. Slack Memorial Award for Excellence in Nontraditional Pet Medicine

An award established by Dr. Slack's colleagues at Alexandria Animal Hospital and friends in memory of Pamela M. Slack, a member of the VMRCVM Class of 1992. It is given to a deserving student on the basis of demonstrated interest and commitment to developing expertise in nontraditional pet and wildlife medicine and surgery, with consideration of financial need.

Southwest Virginia Veterinary Medical Association SCAVMA Award

The President of the Student Chapter of the AVMA at VMRCVM is an acknowledged student leader who has created positive change within SCAVMA and its student membership, as well as contributed to the overall quality of student life at the veterinary college. This cash award is presented annually to the current year's SCAVMA President in recognition of these demonstrated leadership skills, dedication and service. Awarded each fall.

A.C. Spotts, III Award

This award is established to assist a Virginia resident who is a rising fourth year student and who has a demonstrated interest in large animal veterinary medicine. Preference is given to those who reside in the Back Creek area of Pulaski County, the County of Pulaski, or Southwest Virginia. Evidence of academic achievement and financial need are considered.

John T. Stanley Award

An award given to a rising third year student who has demonstrated academic achievement and who has an appreciation for the service provided by the College to the community.

The James M. Stevens Endowed Award

A commemorative certificate and cash award to Virginia residents who have financial need and demonstrate good academic progress.

The "Sundance" Second Time Around Award

This award is given in memory of "Sundance", to a rising fourth year student who is in a second career, has demonstrated academic achievement, and who exemplifies the humble, conscientious, and caring attitude associated with our best clinicians.

Ray Thompson Communication Scholarship

Awarded to a Maryland resident who is recognized by the faculty and their peers as being an effective communicator.

Frank P. VanDresser Memorial Public and Corporate Veterinary Medicine Award

An award donated by Dr. William R. VanDresser in memory of Frank P. VanDresser, awarded to a fourth year student who has demonstrated outstanding proficiency in the area of Public and Corporate Veterinary Medicine.

Edwin and Monica Vaughan

An award established to provide money for summer mission/development trips for students.

E. L. Tyler and C. W. Vaughan, Jr. Endowed Award

An award established to provide funds to DVM students with financial need.

Richard W. and Marie F. Venable Award

An award established for second, third and fourth year veterinary students who have demonstrated a combination of academic achievement, financial need, and an aptitude for clinical veterinary medicine.

Veterinary Leadership Experience Award

Hill's Pet Nutrition and Washington State University established this award to develop future leaders of the profession. The award funds a leadership and team-building experience at Post Falls, Idaho.

Veterinary Learning Award

An award presented to a rising junior with proven academic performance and classroom leadership who overtly represents the Veterinary professional code and is active in on campus or off campus activities geared to community betterment.

Peter L. Via Award

An award established by the Bradley Via Memorial Foundation, providing a scholarship based on high academic achievement, and financial need.

Peter L. Via Award for Large Animal Medicine

An award established by the Bradley Via Memorial Foundation, providing a scholarship based on interest in large animal medicine, high academic achievement, and financial need.

Virginia Federation of Dog Clubs and Breeders Award

An award presented to financially deserving Virginia students based on academic merit, financial need, and an interest in purebred dogs.

The Virginia Kennel Club Award

This award is for a VMRCVM student based upon an interest in purebred dogs.

Virginia Veterinary Medical Association Auxiliary Award

An award established for a financially deserving Virginia resident who has demonstrated dedication to the veterinary profession.

Virginia Veterinary Medical Association Scholarship

An award to support Virginia resident DVM students with financial need, leadership potential, involvement in organized veterinary medicine and interest in legislation affecting the profession.

Andrea L. Walnes Award

An award given to a student who is interested in Equine Sports Medicine, with preference given for a student who is a former or current resident of Giles, Pulaski, or Montgomery Counties, and/or who demonstrates an interest in working with children.

Western Veterinary Conference Award

An award given to a rising 4th year student based upon strong leadership qualities and financial need.

Marion A. Williams and Annie Webster Williams Fellowship

An award established to support financially deserving Virginia resident students, with preference given to students who have resided in Franklin, Patrick, Henry, or Floyd Counties in Virginia.

I.D. Wilson Biology Award for Veterinary Medicine Students

An award to support veterinary professional students at the VMRCVM, with preference given to a student who is a former Virginia Tech biology student.

W.R. Winslow Trust Award

An award established for financially deserving students from the District of Columbia, North Carolina, Maryland, or Virginia who have demonstrated dedication to the veterinary profession.

Dorothy Wornom Memorial Award

An award to aid a deserving student entering veterinary medicine, who has financial need.

Tyler J. and Frances F. Young Award

An award offered to students on the basis of academic achievement, financial need, extracurricular leadership, and satisfactory progress toward a degree at Virginia Tech.

Dr. Charles G. Ziegler Memorial Scholarship

An award given to a Maryland resident in the third year of the DVM curriculum based on financial need.
