To Whom It May Concern:

This is to certify that students in the College of Veterinary Medicine at Virginia Tech are insured through a Commonwealth of Virginia self-insured liability program covering all state employees. Coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000 per occurrence is provided for employees and agents of Virginia Tech.

Students engaged in on-the-job activities required as part of their academic program are insured under this coverage as long as they are not employed by the individual, company or agency for whom they are working. Virginia Tech's insurance coverage will not apply if the student becomes the employee of another party.

Briefly stated, general liability insurance coverage is afforded to students provided they meet the following criteria:

- 1) They are enrolled at Virginia Tech
- 2) They are performing activities (preceptorship, externships, practicum's, on-the-Training), which are required as a part of their course study.
- 3) They are not employed by the organization, during the academic period, for which they are performing the work.

This liability insurance is not health or accident insurance. Students are individually responsible for providing their own health and accident insurance.
