

Dr. P. Christopher Roberts

Dr. P. Christopher Roberts is an associate professor in the Department of Biomedical Sciences and Pathobiology in the Virginia-Maryland College of Veterinary Medicine at Virginia Tech. Roberts obtained his Bachelor's Degree in biology from Davidson College in North Carolina. He obtained his master's degree and his Ph.D. from Philipps-Universität in Marburg, Germany. Prior to joining the college in 2007, he was a postdoctoral research associate at Emory University in Atlanta, GA before moving to Wayne State University in 1999 as an assistant professor. Roberts has been funded by the National Institutes of Health since 1999, working on various aspects of influenza virus pathogenesis and vaccine development. He also actively pursues mechanistic studies pertaining to progression of ovarian cancer using a mouse model he and his collaborator, Dr. Eva Schmelz, from Virginia Tech's Department of Human Nutrition Foods and Exercise, developed. He is member of the American Society for Microbiology (ASM), the American Society for Virology (ASV) and the American Association of Cancer Research (AACR). He currently serves on the NIH "Bugs and Drugs" Special Emphasis Panel.
