

Dr. John J. Dascanio

Dr. John J. Dascanio is an associate professor of theriogenology and equine field services in the Department of Large Animal Clinical Sciences in the Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine at Virginia Tech. He earned his VMD from the University of Pennsylvania and completed his residency and internship at Cornell University. Prior to joining the college in 1993, he was an assistant professor at Oregon State University. Dr. Dascanio's research interests are centered in the field of equine reproduction. His other main research focus concerns the use of computers and information technology to enhance veterinary education for students, horse owners and veterinary practitioners (<http://eqrepro.vetmed.vt.edu>). He is board certified as a diplomate by the American College of Theriogenologists and as a diplomate by the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners-Equine Specialty. Dr. Dascanio is a member of several professional organizations including the American Veterinary Medical Association, the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP), the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners, the American College of Theriogenologists, the Society for Theriogenology, and the Chi Chapter of Phi Zeta Veterinary Honor Society.
