After practicing as a small animal/exotic animal practitioner in West Covina, CA, Dr. Morgan began her career with APHIS in 1985 as a Veterinary Medical Officer hired as a participant in APHIS' first class of the Public Veterinary Practice Career Program (PVPCP) in Logan, UT. In 1986, Dr. Morgan joined the staff in APHIS headquarters, in Hyattsville, MD, that later became APHIS' Recruitment and Development (R&D) division. While working in that division, she managed the PVPCP from 1986-1989. From 1989-1997, Dr. Morgan worked as a Senior Staff Veterinarian in the Veterinary Services National Center for Import and Export.

Dr. Morgan brings a wealth of experience and expertise to the Veterinary Services. During her many successful years with APHIS, Dr. Morgan has served a number of key leadership positions. From 1997-1999, she served as Acting Director for the Veterinary Services Professional Development Staff. Later in 1999, between March and October, she became the APHIS Invasive Species Coordinator. From October 1999 till February 2002, she assumed the responsibilities of the Veterinary Services Associate Director of Animal Health Programs. In March 2002, Dr. Morgan was appointed Veterinary Services Acting Associate Deputy Administrator for the National Animal Health Policy and Programs (NAHPP) located in Riverdale, MD. She served in that position until June of 2002 when she joined the Veterinary Services National Center for Import and Export Technical Trade Services Team as Senior Staff Veterinarian. On January 12, 2003, Dr. Morgan was appointed Veterinary Services Associate Deputy Administrator for Regional Operations, a position that she still holds today. While serving as Associate Deputy Administrator for Veterinary Services Regional Operations, she also had the privilege to be the Incident Commander of the National BSE (Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy) Surveillance Team from January 2004 till November 2004.

Dr. Morgan received a Bachelors degree in Agriculture from the University of Missouri in 1982. In 1985, she received her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the same university and in 1990 she received a Masters in Education and Human Development from George Washington University. Dr. Morgan was born and raised in St. Louis, MO. She now resides in Laurel, MD.
